

Exhibitor Information

No Entry in classes after 10.00am

1. A plainly written list of articles intended for exhibition with class numbers in this schedule should be submitted on or before 9.00pm on THURSDAY 13th SEPTEMBER 2019. Entries later than this will be accepted on payment of 20p extra entrance fee for each article. This rule will be strictly enforced.
2. On the day of the show articles must be brought for exhibition between 8.30am and 10.00am after which they will be refused. Articles cannot be removed again until 4.00pm.
3. No person may show vegetables, fruit or flowers which they have not grown in their own garden or allotment; flowers in arrangements are exempt. Plants in pots must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least two months before the show.
4. Any exhibitor attempting deception will forfeit all claims to prizes.
5. Prizes awarded at the discretion of the judges when less than 4 entries in a class
6. The committee reserve the right to refuse any article exhibited
7. Exhibitors are allowed one entry in each class

Fruit Cake: (class 59) 150g butter; 150g caster sugar; 200g self raising flour; 3 eggs; ¼ tsp. salt; 300g mixed dried fruit; 50g candied peel; grated peel ½ lemon or orange; milk as required. Bake in 18cm (7") round tin.

Victoria Sandwich; (class 61 and 75) 150 self raising flour; 150g caster sugar; 150g butter; 3 eggs; Bake in 2;20cm(8") round tins
Jam filling

Fruit Scones (class 78) 200g self raising flour ; pinch salt; 50g butter; 2 tbsp. caster sugar; 50g sultanas; 1 egg; milk as required
