
If you would like your child to attend Breakfast Club, Drop & Play or CAST, please book a place using the app.

#### **FSU**

In maths this week Reception have been comparing sizes. We have tried to order ourselves, the animals from Noah's Ark in height order, as well as some Russian Dolls and stacking boxes. We also used maths language to describe and compare towers of cubes that we made. Nursery children have also been thinking about size through story, finding objects and comparing their length. FSU have also been introduced to the concepts of Capacity and Mass.



# Year 3 & 4

Year 3 and 4 have had a busy week with assessments and have worked extremely hard, so it was nice to be able to get out on the field in the fresh air and run around with the Rugby X coach yesterday. For many of the children it was their first taste of rugby and they all did really well.
